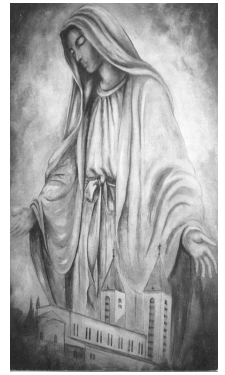

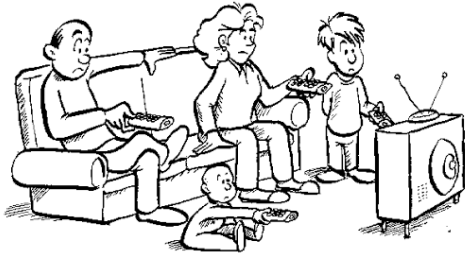

On Watching TV

Laureen is an active young woman in a big city of Holland. She is single and works with much zeal, spreading Gospa's messages. She never finds herself jobless when it comes to serving Her! The experience she shares here may inspire us to make good use of our freedom!



"I had not watched TV for 15 years. But four months ago I got a subscription. My objective was to stay in touch with world events. But after four months I had to cancel my subscription. I had the clear conviction that this was the right decision to make.

Why?? Because when I watched TV at night, I became empty. Even if it was a news program informing me of the day's events in the world so that I could pray for them afterwards, no way, it just didn't work for me. Each time, the same thing happened: after watching TV for an hour, I could no longer pray because my heart became hard and something in me was cut off from God, from my source. Then I wouldn't pray for the events, because my mind was confused. I asked myself why and I found the answer: when I watch TV, the spirit of the world enters my heart. At the moment I press the button, I plug myself into the spirit of the world, I consciously say "YES" to it. Then this spirit eats away what is related to God in me and I become emptier and emptier.

Upon deciding to get rid of TV, I acted immediately by canceling my subscription the next day. As I mailed the letter, great joy came into my heart. I was immersed in a light and could feel that Heaven agreed with my decision. Then I said to the Blessed Mother: "Since I will not spend an hour watching the evening news on TV, I am going to give this hour to the Rosary." From that day onward I have been praying a whole Rosary every night. While I used to waste my time and my life in the Spirit by watching TV, now I feel I am not wasting my time at all! Besides, since I have been praying the Rosary, I have felt a great urge to fast. I can see it clearly: by being consistent in one thing, one gets the strength to grow and be able to be consistent in other things too. Praying the Rosary every night has given me the strength and the space to fast on bread and water as the Blessed Mother is asking.

I don't mean to generalize, since this is my own way to give God the first place in this time of my life. I've discerned that it was God's desire for me to get rid of TV, at least the way TV is offered right now. If we chose to watch TV, then a great vigilance is needed in order to be protected from the Evil one. He is so active through some programs!

"At night, no matter how late it is, I pray for an hour before I go to bed. This is the time when joy enters my heart and when everything falls into place. Of course it is important to make contact with others in order to grow in the spiritual life, through telephone calls for example, but I realize that this becomes possible only after having immersed myself in God's presence

Mirjana's Apparition of March 18th

The visionary Mirjana Dragicevic-Soldo had daily apparitions from June 24th 1981 to December 25th 1982. During her last daily apparition, Our Lady gave her the 10th secret, and told her that she would appear to her once a year, on the 18th of March, her birthday. It has been that way through the years.

After 5 years, on August 2nd, 1987, the "Monthly Apparitions of the 2nd" began. Mirjana prayed with Our Lady for non-believers, or as Our Lady said: "For those who have not yet experienced God's Love". These 2nd of the month apparitions were private for about 10 years, then in 1997, Our Lady asked that the apparitions be made public. Mirjana herself said that the monthly apparitions on the 2nd of each month, were temporary and would last as long as

Our Lady deemed it appropriate. In these apparitions the Virgin Mary invited us to pray for conversions, and for those who are far from faith. This year's message calls us to the love of 'her Son.'

"Dear children, in a motherly way I am calling you to return to the joy and the truth of the Gospel, to return to the love of my Son – because He is waiting for you with open arms; that everything you do in life you do with my Son, with love; that it may be blessed for you; so that your spirituality may be internal, and not just external. Only in that way will you be humble, generous, filled with love and joyful; and my motherly heart will rejoice with you. Thank you."

On February 25th, 2021, the visionary Marija Pavlovic Lunetti received the following monthly message:

"Dear children! God has permitted me to be with you also today, to call you to prayer and fasting. Live this time of grace and be witnesses of hope, because I repeat to you, little children, that also with prayer and fasting can wars be suppressed. Little children, believe and live this time of grace in faith and with faith; and my Immaculate Heart does not leave any of you in lack of peace if you have recourse to me. I intercede for you before the Most High and I pray for peace in your hearts and for hope for the future. Thank you for having responded to my call."

Hip surgery for Sister

I will be in Italy for an operation on my hip. But before leaving, I wrote this for you, so as not to leave you without some words of encouragement during this month which is dedicated to our dear Saint Joseph! My favorite story, because it is so very moving, takes us into the depths of China, this country that is so dear to God and that I have been blessed to visit 10 times these past years.

A woman in China

Two Austrian Jesuit missionaries, Father Gotsch and Brother Gervasius, testified in 1976 to a unique experience: "One day, in southern China, Brother Gervasius was accompanying Fr. Gotsch on his way to see a dying man in Kaotai. They crossed 200 km of mountains and hills on horseback and arrived at the house of the dying man.

Too late, he had already died. After the funeral, they started back. They were halfway along when they saw a young man who seemed to be waiting for them by the side of the road. The young man asked them to follow him to see his sick mother. They followed this young man to a small village 15 km away.

In a very modest home, a woman was dying. Seeing the priest, she asked him: "Stranger, will you tell me the truth if I ask you some questions?" "Of course, mother."

"Is there a God in whom there are three persons? Is there another life, a place of happiness for good people, and a place of terror for the bad ones? Is it true that God came to this earth

to die for men and open the place of happiness to them? Stranger, is it true, all this?"

Stunned, the priest replied YES. But from whom could this woman have learned all this?

The woman continued: "You have the water with you, so wash me, that I may go to the place of happiness!" How did she know that the priest had water on him for baptisms? There was something both childish and convincing in her determined attitude. The priest briefly explained to her the liturgy and the meaning of the sacrament, and then he baptized her.

The newly baptized woman, full of joy, then said: "You also have the bread with you. This is a special bread because God is in it. Give me that bread!"

The priest took out of his bag the consecrated host he was carrying with him. The lady knew he had "The Bread"! The priest explained to her the meaning of the sacrament of the Eucharist, and gave her Holy Communion. He also administered the last rites (Confession and Anointing of the sick). Then he said to her: "Until now, you have been the one asking questions. Now it is my turn to ask you! From whom did you learn the truths of the faith? Did you meet Catholic believers or evangelists?"

"No, stranger".

"So, did you read Christian books?"

"I don't know how to read, stranger, and I didn't even know there were books like this."

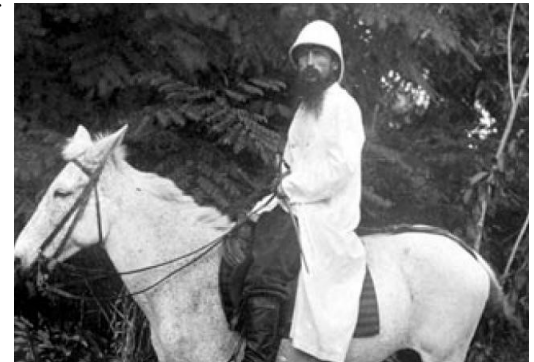
"So, where and from whom did you receive this knowledge about the faith?"

"I always thought that it should be like this, and for the last 10 years I have lived this way. I also instructed my sons this way. And you can wash them all (baptize them)".

"But did you know that we were going to pass through here today?"

"Of course! I saw a man in a dream. He was the one who told me to send my youngest son on the road and call the two strangers who would be passing by. He told me that they were going to "wash me" in order to go to the place of happiness after death".

Stacy's Story: Return to Faith

I grew up north of Seattle in St. Mark's parish with my two sisters during the 1970s. During our time at St. Mark's, we were an involved parish family. By the time we got to high school, we were still attending Mass but less frequently, and by the time I got to college, I was really no longer attending regularly and then frankly not at all.

I was always an introverted person and always prayerful, but that part of my spiritual practice just slipped away as I stretched my wings at college. It seems strange to me now to think about that.

But it all changed for me in 2016. At the end of 2015, I became aware of a place called Medjugorje, which if you've never heard of, is a very small town in Bosnia Herzegovina. It's a place where six local children in 1981 began to claim to have visions of the Virgin Mary. At the time this happened, the youngest, Jakov, was 9 years old.

But what really blew my mind as I learned about this place, was that the alleged visions were still happening actively in my lifetime. I couldn't believe this.

I just couldn't believe that I had never heard of this place. I couldn't shake it off. I tried. I was busy, and I didn't have time for it. But I couldn't shake it off. I would say to you that it felt like a calling. It was unmistakable.

I had all these obstacles to going. Nothing was going to line up – time, money, the whole nine yards. One by one, each of those obstacles began to fall away, and so I couldn't deny it. And I just – I went.

Within a few months, I found myself there on my own, by myself. There I was. I had to see for myself what was going on. It was a week of prayer and reflection without the distractions of daily life. It was really remarkable to take that time out and do that and just absorb the sense of that place.

But I will tell you there was one experience that I had during that week that was remarkable and that has stayed with me ever since. There would be a daily English Mass at Saint James and I realized about halfway through the week that I could not wait to get to Mass. I was like a little kid. I felt like I had Willy Wonka's golden ticket, and I could not

wait for the show to start. It was unmistakable and I have never really been able to find the words to describe that experience, but it was amazing. I couldn't wait to get in the door. It was as if everything about the Mass was suddenly illuminated for me, and it became a celebration of pure joy, peace, and love. I couldn't wait to get there every morning.

What is the most remarkable thing about it, is that, in the time since that trip, that sense of the Mass and that excitement has never diminished or abated. Never. I am aware that my fifteen year old self and my twenty year old self and even my thirty something year old self would find that hilarious. All the mornings that I preferred to sleep in and skip Mass. Always with one foot in and one foot out the door of my Catholic life. I couldn't wait to get to Mass, and I have that same sense today.

I flew home from this trip on a Friday night. On Saturday morning, I came to the church. I couldn't wait to get in. I drove over and I came in the door. All of a sudden there's Father Mark bounding down the aisle, "Hi! I'm Father Mark. And you are?"

And I said, "I'm Stacy and I have so many questions."

"Oh great! I knew there was a reason why I got here early this morning."

We began this ongoing dialog between us about the Catholic Church and some of the issues that I'd had with it over the years. It was really the first time I'd had an experience receiving spiritual direction as an adult without all the fire and brimstone that I'd experienced as a child and had found very off-putting.

Within a month, I was a registered parishioner, and a little bit longer than that, at his request, I became a lector. It's been remarkable. I can tell you, looking back, that I did not realize how much I missed being part of a spiritual community until I got it back.

I had put my Catholicism on a shelf so gradually over the years that I didn't really notice the lack of it until my cup was once again full. I'd never lost my faith in God. What I lost was a Catholic community in which to practice and celebrate my faith publicly.

What has being part of this community meant to me? It's become a community that supported me when one of my best friends died later in 2016. This community supported me again in 2019 when my dad died. I think we live in a time of such divisiveness. Evil divides and separates, but our shared love of God unites us. I've come to realize that faith requires eternal vigilance and action – active participation to remain vital and vibrant.

Fr Livio: Already last month Our Lady prepared us for Lent saying that we must awaken and renew ourselves like nature and inviting us to prayer and fasting. Today the invitation to prayer and fasting is repeated twice. The second time she said that even wars can be suppressed with prayer and fasting. It seems to me to be a special moment. Our Lady had already said that Satan wants war, he wants hatred ...

Marija: Here in Medjugorje with sunny days, very spring like days, we live as in a privileged oasis: the cases of Covid have disappeared here and you no longer even wear a mask. In this time of penance, of Lent, people go up to the Hills. For the Croatian people there is a particular sensitivity to fasting and renunciation in the time of Lent; more in Eastern countries, less in Western countries where there is wealth and sacrifice, fasting, prayer, etc. have been forgotten.

Turning on the radio, not only the Catholic one, you hear prayers and songs of Lent. In this time of coronavirus this need to pray more and rebuild the spiritual life has awakened. I am praying for Italy because there is so much need. Thank God there are so many prayer groups that even during the lockdown continued on through prayer using modern means. Our Lady tells us: *“Live this time of grace and be witnesses of hope because, I repeat to you little children, with prayer and fasting even wars can be suppressed.”* I believe that a person who prays has great faith. At first it's a bit difficult, but then slowly we get to the point that we can no longer live without prayer. So also with fasting. I remember many wonderful experiences. Today a large group from America called me saying that they offered nine days of fasting on bread and water for the intentions of Our Lady. They asked me to offer this sacrifice to Our Lady during the apparition. I did and Our Lady smiled. The most beautiful thing is what Our Lady tells us: to believe that prayer and fasting really work miracles, stop wars, change hearts, suspend natural disasters. I believe that today's invitation of Our Lady to fasting and prayer is also due to this virus that has put fear inside us. Our Lady tells us that if we return to prayer and fasting we will no longer be afraid.

Fr Livio: Can you explain which fasting Our Lady asked for throughout the year on Wednesdays and Fridays from midnight to midnight?

Marija: I want to clarify one thing because a priest said that he had heard my testimony in which I said that at midnight and one minute we put water for the spaghetti. Let me be clear: if there is no love, do not fast; if there is no desire, but a spirit of criticism, don't do it! We must do it with the heart. At the beginning Our Lady invited us to fast on bread and water on Friday and then also on Wednesday. We have made many novenas, even the forty days of Lent, novenas before the holidays, but always with much, much love. If you begin to criticize and say that it is too difficult, give up fasting! Fasting is an invitation that Our Lady made us and if we believe in her, in her presence and in her help, fasting is a gesture of love and I know that my renunciation makes sense, because with fasting and

prayer even wars can be removed. If you cannot fast with bread and water, do some renunciation, renunciation of language, renunciation of meat, wine, smoke, telephone, games, of computers, you know where the weak point in your life is. Get on your knees and pray, because one who prays fasts more easily, with more love and becomes even more steadfast in faith. Prayer is not simple repetition, but it becomes life. Prayer also becomes union between Christians who love, share and stay together like the first Christians. We see this with the pilgrims who arrived in Medjugorje in the early years: we have a solid friendship more than between blood brothers and sisters, because it is a brotherhood founded on faith. So it is with so many priests, so many nuns who have found their vocation here.

Fr Livio: Once again Our Lady invites us to be witnesses of hope. It seems to mean: “You are in a situation where you can get discouraged and think that all is lost, but you must testify that instead my Immaculate Heart will triumph”. It seems that this is the mission that Our Lady entrusts to us.



Marija: Exactly. I believe that Our Lady has prepared us throughout these years. Just today I spoke to my friend Jelena, a schoolmate, then of the prayer group and also united in the persecution suffered by communism. We have gone through very hard times, very difficult times, but strengthened by the grace that the Lord has given us with these people, these friendships, sisters and brothers in Christ, who have always supported us. We were daily in danger of life. The police frightened us, they took us to the asylum, to hospitals, they locked us up in a room like in a prison. Thank goodness, being minors, they didn't put us in a real prison like Father Jozo. Forty years have passed and it seems like four days, because in our heart there is the freshness of the presence of the Madonna in our midst. As we speak among us, it seems that Our Lady is walking with us. The Lord has given us this grace: we have been chosen by God. Our gratitude is great. With emotion in our hearts we say: “Lord, why so much grace for me?” Even if this grace also involves pain and suffering. We are often not understood. But with those people who embraced the message of Our Lady with us, we shared prayer, sacrifices, many penances, we were on the Hills with the cold wind. All this with the intention of making a sacrifice and offering it for the intentions of Our Lady, so that she presents everything to her Son Jesus for peace in the world, for peace in hearts, in families, so that wars may end.

Fr Livio: Our Lady tells us: Believe and live in faith and with faith and in this time that there is restlessness, confusion, agitation, we have so many problems, She makes us a beautiful promise: *“... my Heart Immaculate does not leave any of you in restlessness if you have recourse to me.”* She exhorts us to give all that disturbs and frightens us to her Mother's Heart.

Marija: What a joy when I heard these words! So many people confide in me their anxieties, fear of the future. I say that we are in God's hands. If it is God's will, I can die of heart attack, coronavirus or something else; it may be that I have to go through an ordeal of suffering. But if I am a person of faith I

The missionaries were deeply moved. The woman's attitude toward death was so peaceful that she left no room for doubt. Before leaving, the missionaries offered her an image of Saint Joseph, patron saint of the dying. Filled with joy, the woman exclaimed:



"But this one, I know him! He often comes to visit me. He was the one who told me to send my son on the road to call you!"

Was it in a dream, or did St. Joseph really come to visit her in person? She didn't know. In

fact, knowing that did not matter. What was important was what St. Joseph had taught this woman. The missionaries later learned that the woman died that very night. (From the German magazine *"Weite Welt"* No. 1, Jan. 1976)

We do not know where the fruits of our prayer go, but God knows! In France, the UK, the USA or elsewhere, who has prayed to St. Joseph for the intentions of the Heavenly Father and for the salvation of souls? Which poor person in their local parish bowed to the statue of St. Joseph to beg him for help, and unknowingly through that prayer helped someone in China? Which elderly person scribbled the litanies of St. Joseph on a piece of paper, to be prayed in the evening, in the solitude of his little room, without anyone knowing? Which young person once begged this great saint to reveal his vocation and to embark on the right path? Which sick person cried out to St. Joseph to have a good death and be able to present a pure soul before the Creator? Saint Joseph is generous, he always extends the fruits of our petitions to so many people in need, without confining himself to our requests which are often so limited to our personal needs.

I can happily imagine the beautiful encounter of this Chinese woman in Heaven, with the person who unwittingly obtained for her the grace to leave this earth, clothed in the white robe of Baptism, and strengthened by the Eucharistic presence in her heart! For sure, Heaven will be interwoven with all these humble prayers offered in secret, and their sublime fruits...

So, let us not fail to pray to St. Joseph and ask much of him! He will give infinitely more than our desires can imagine. Was he not chosen among all men to be the Bridegroom of the Mother of God and the adoptive father of the Son of God?

How can we live the fast that pleases God?

Mary invites us to live all things with the heart, which is why the fast she recommends, namely bread and water on Wednesdays and Fridays, goes hand in hand with a beautiful inner attitude that gives great value and great power to our fasting from food. True fasting is not a diet, the purpose of which would be to lose weight, but a way to grow in our communion of love with God and with our brothers. This exhortation can help us make a good fast during Lent! Also, by examining specific parts of our life, we allow the Lord to prune us. We can then decide for God in a better way, in spirit and truth!

through prayer. Prayer first, then the rest follows! Concretely, if I have to decide whether I'll talk with someone or pray, I will give priority to prayer. Thus, I receive the inner freedom that I need to be led by the Holy Spirit. It is He who then can inspire me to make contact with someone or not."

"In the 80s, Gospa sometimes mentioned TV, however she never forbade it nor asked that we throw our TV sets away. As a Mother, she knows well that this would be too hard for some of her children (those who suffer from depression or excessive loneliness have sometimes only their TV to hear and see other folks!). Besides, some programs are very good. It is up to us to produce many more good ones! But for the fasting days, Our Lady said:

- **"If you do not have the strength to fast on bread and water, you can give up other things. It would be a good thing to renounce television, because after watching some programs, you are distracted and unable to pray..."** (December 8, 1981).

- **"If you watch the programs, if you look at the newspapers, your mind is filled with news, then there is no longer any place for me in your hearts"** (April 17, 1986).

To the prayer group of young people formed and guided by her in Medjugorje during seven years, she said: - **"Renounce all passions and all inordinate desires. Avoid television, particularly evil programs, excessive sports, the unreasonable enjoyment of food and drink, alcohol, tobacco..."** (given to Jelena Vasilj on June 16, 1983). Mary also wishes that we switch off TV during the nine days before great feast days like Easter and Christmas. She has asked that our families gather and, with the Bible in hand, we share about the texts related to the coming feast (as the Jews do!)

heal faster. Scientists also say it: those who have faith have that positivity in them that also stimulates healing. Our Lady places this peace, this serenity, this hope of not being afraid of the future in our hearts. The hope that our grandparents lived, the hope that the first Christians lived, even dying martyrs torn to pieces in the arenas. Even today there are Christians who die for the faith. Our Lady from the beginning recommended making a good confession. If we truly believe in the sacrament, a new life begins with a good confession. There is a lot of confusion and confession helps us a lot. Once in the prayer group Our Lady said that even if the priest were a great sinner, his absolution is valid, it is grace. This time of Lent is not only an invitation to prayer, fasting, renunciation, little sacrifices, but also to a good confession ...

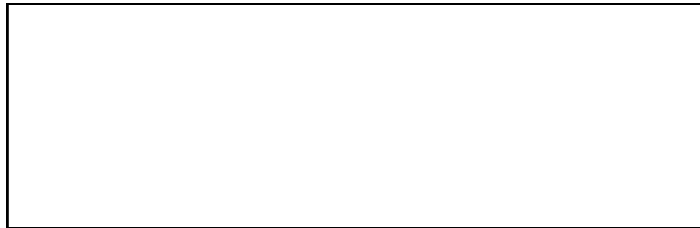
